SUBJECT: AH1N1 Flu (Swine Influenza)

SITUATION REPORT #7b

DATE AND TIME COVERED: Thursday, May 07, 2009, 9:00 – 17:00

1. **CURRENT SITUATION:** Due to the health emergency that exists in the State of Texas, the Rio Grande Valley and Hidalgo County, the Emergency Operations Center has been activated to assist Health Authorities coordinate activities. Demobilization of the EOC begins today, and will be closed by Saturday.

As of May 7, 2009, 16:30, Hidalgo County Health & Human Services has received notification from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) that **in the County of Hidalgo, there is one (1) confirmed case, six (6) probable case and 307 suspect cases, and eleven (11) hospitalized influenza like illness (ILI) cases.** Suspect is defined as exhibiting ALL of the following symptoms: Fever above 102.5 degrees, body ache, diarrhea, vomiting, respiratory complications, sore throat and coughing.

Orders have not been issued by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or DSHS for the use of masks for the general public. The only masking recommendations are as follows: For emergency responders, law enforcement, hospital emergency room staff, only, while in the presence of suspected infection. If a patient or client exhibits flu-like symptoms, mask the patient/client in question. This is a droplet borne disease, not airborne. Follow Tuberculosis (TB) protocols and use droplet precautions. School districts may decide on their own if masks should be used in their schools, but it has not been ordered or recommended by the CDC or DSHS.

Hidalgo County is working with UT Rural Health Studies to gather data from this event for analysis.

Hidalgo County has received antiviral medications, Relenza & Tamiflu. Distribution to Federally Qualified Health Clinics is directly from the State. There is no shortage of meds at this time.

Hidalgo County has activated the Hidalgo County Flu Information Hotline, open during normal County business hours, from 8am-5pm, Monday thru Friday. The number is 1-866-613-5277. The hotline will not be active on the weekend.

The Hidalgo County Prescription Drug Discount Card does provide a discount for Tamiflu & Relenza, with a valid doctor's prescription, at a local participating pharmacy. Mexican Consulate: As of May 7, 2009, 9:00, there are zero (0) confirmed case along the Mexican side of the Texas/Mexico border along the Rio Grande Valley. Consul Representative reports that High Schools and University level schools will resume classes today. Classes at elementary level will resume on Monday. Businesses have re-opened throughout Mexico today.

School Closures: School closures in Hidalgo County include all campuses in the Weslaco ISD, until May 11th. Weslaco ISD staff is working on Friday, May 8, 2009 for cleaning the schools, and classes will resume on May 11th. Donna ISD has decided to close all campuses as well until May 12th. Mercedes ISD has closed all schools until May 11th. No other public schools have been closed in Hidalgo County.

Hidalgo County Health & Human Services does not recommend cancellation of school or child activities. If any child involved in the school or child activity shows any of the flu-like symptoms, send the child home. The only school activities to consider cancelling would be those activities involving students with medical special needs, whom are more susceptible to contracting the H1N1 flu.

With schools going back to session, Hidalgo County Health & Human Services recommends for schools to diligently monitor flu-like illnesses in their school, as well as absenteeism.

Travel: Airlines maintain a high level of alert, and is at their discretion of who may board and who may not board, based on the airline's assessment of the traveler at check-in.
